History of Junior League of Phoenix Foundation

The Junior League of Phoenix Foundation (JLPF) was formed in 2004 to support the community programs of the Junior League of Phoenix (JLP). The Foundation began granting money to the JLP in 2010 and started requesting grant applications in 2014. In total, the Foundation has granted \$256,900 to JLP community programs and member training initiatives.

Our Commitment to Helping Communities in Need: St. Vincent de Paul & Harvest Compassion Center

In 2022-2023, the Foundation continued to provide grant support to JLP's partnerships with St. Vincent de Paul and the Harvest Compassion Center. As both organizations provide healthy, fresh food to members of our community who are in need, these partnerships supported JLP's focus area of "Fighting Hunger in the Greater Phoenix Community." The Foundation is proud to have provided financial support to these organizations over the past three years.

The Junior League of Phoenix Foundation grant made possible a Networking Night with Maisha Christian, owner of Beauty and the Boss. The presentation “Closing the Gaps: Negotiate Your Way to Better Pay and Opportunities” was open to all JLP members and the public. JLP members had the chance to sign up for a pocket coach deck that can be used as a tool for practicing lessons learned during the presentation. JLP members will use these tips to assist the women and girls they will encounter in their new community partnerships with Girl Scouts and Live and Learn.



Looking to the Future

In March of 2023, Junior League of Phoenix members voted to update their mission statement to align with the new mission statement of the Association of Junior Leagues International. The new mission statement reads: The Junior League of Phoenix, Inc. is an organization of women whose mission is to advance women's leadership for meaningful community impact through volunteer action, collaboration, and training. Along with the new mission statement, JLP members voted to adopt a new focus area: Empowering Women and Girls to be academically and financially successful. Over the next five years, the Foundation will provide financial support to JLP as they develop new community programs with their community partners (Live and Learn and Girls Scouts – Arizona Cactus-Pine Council) in this new focus area.

Grant Funding

In the Spring of 2023, the Junior League of Phoenix Foundation Board of Directors voted to grant \$30,000 to support Junior League of Phoenix’s mission to develop the potential of women and improve our community through action and leadership.
